

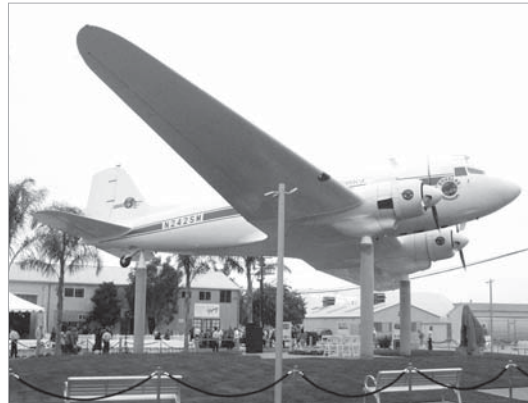
# SANTA MONICA airport ARTWALK

saturday MARCH 20TH 1pm-5pm

*One of L.A. County's oldest operating airfields, Santa Monica Airport* has a rich background as the former home of the Douglas Aircraft Company and the birthplace of the DC-3. In addition, the airport has developed over time into an arts incubator, and is home to a number of creative venues. The City of Santa Monica Airport Division and Cultural Affairs Division, and participating tenants, invite you to discover this hidden cultural resource with its unique, creative atmosphere. Many resident artists sell work from their studios, so feel free to inquire about making a purchase.

## DOUGLAS DC-3 MONUMENT

Donald W. Douglas founded his aircraft manufacturing empire in Santa Monica just 17 years after the Wright brothers' first flight in 1903. In 1924, his Douglas World Cruisers were the first aircraft to circumnavigate the globe, and, in 1933, he introduced his famed DC series of passenger planes that again revolutionized air travel. The monument onsite is comprised of a restored DC-3 and a lifesize statue of Douglas by sculptor Yossi Govrin.

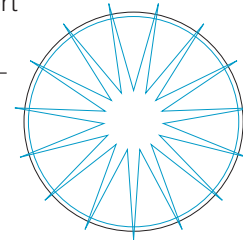

## ARENA 1 GALLERY

ARENA 1 Gallery presents *FOUND*, a group show of six Los Angeles artists that work in collage and mixed-media. Curated by Sandra Vista, the theme of the show centers on the objects and materials found at scrap yards and recycling centers. The artists take "field trips" to various sites to find material, which they then integrate while maintaining their individual artistic styles. 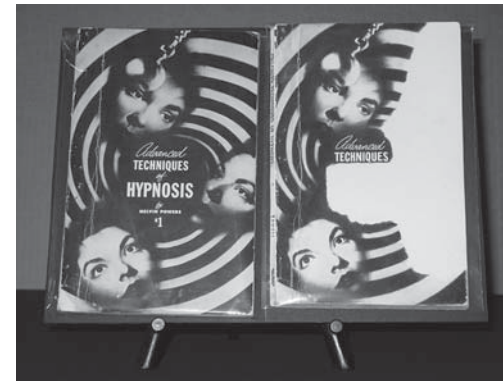

## SHERRY FRUMKIN GALLERY

IAN EVERARD: *TWELVE SUGGESTIONS*, an exhibition of twelve paintings of twelve copies of twelve books created over twelve months. Beginning his series with the found book *Advanced Techniques of Hypnosis*, the installation includes twelve tables – one for each of twelve books and paintings – that mimics the circumstance of the artist's studio, with its generic furniture and equipment. The viewer may peer through the lens of twelve magnifying lamps and glimpse the artist's state of mind through spoken words and the moving images contained in three black boxes. The work examines the hypnotic image and suggests resemblances, associations and worlds within and without, the labyrinth of the visible.

Exhibition runs March 20 – May 15, 2010.

### art mentor program

The Art Mentor Program is a unique learning experience for a select group of SMC Art Department students. Students are challenged to explore their creative work and that of others, and to solve problems in innovative ways. Students create portfolios, study preparatory practice and are introduced to the dynamics of galleries, museums, curators and collectors. The program assists students in becoming more competitive, stimulating the awareness and intellectual tools required to present themselves as professionals in local and international visual art communities. The Art Mentor Program is led by SMC Art Department Chair Ronn Davis, with adjunct faculty Kavin Buck and Ichiro Irie.

### ceramic arts

SMC's Ceramic Arts offers instruction designed to promote conceptual, technical and aesthetic processes, and encourage individual expression and creativity. Courses include hand building, mold casting and wheel forming, with emphases on surface decoration, glaze chemistry, stacking and firing. College students will be onsite demonstrating molding, photo transfer, hand forming and wheel-throwing techniques. The ceramics program is led by Fanklyn Philips. Don't miss the raku firing demonstrations at the top of the hour throughout the afternoon.

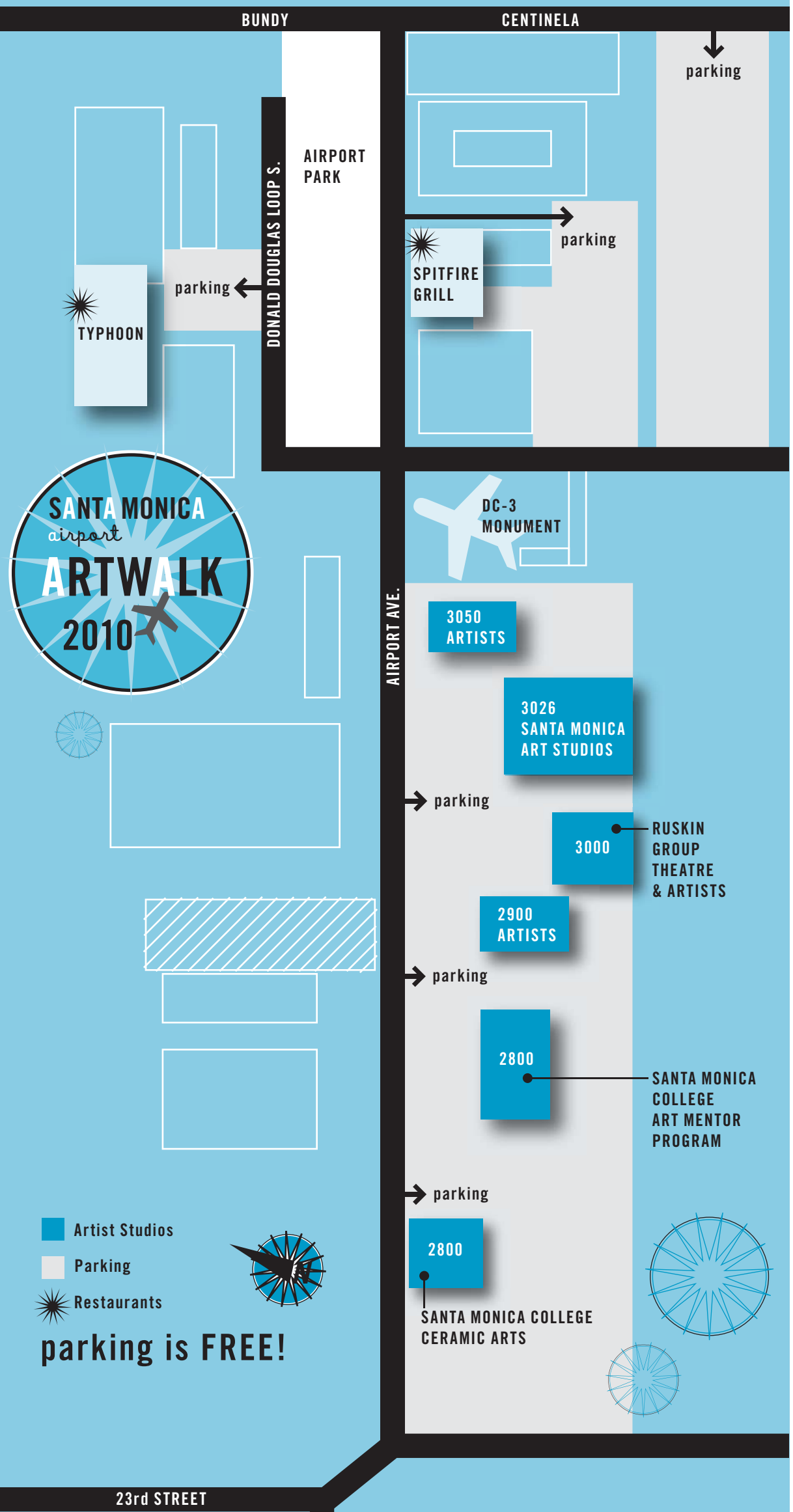
